Exodus 14:10-20

These are helpful lessons to learn from Moses as he provided leadership to the Israelites headed to the Promised Land.

# SOME OF OUR GREATEST CHALLENGES ARE NOT IN FRONT OF US BUT BEHIND US.

"As Pharoah approached, the Israelites looked up, and there were the Egyptians, marching after them" (v. 10).

- The ghost of yesteryear may march after us.
- Fears, haunted griefs, and frustrations try to hang around.
- Same old sin may dog one. The Israelites left Egypt, but not the Egyptians.

"...I do not consider myself yet to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead" (Phil 3:13).

#### GOD GOES BEFORE; HE ALSO STANDS BEHIND US.

"Then the angel of God, who had been traveling in front...withdrew and went behind them. The pillar of cloud also moved from in front of them and stood behind them" (v. 19).

- God offers his guidance.
- God invites us to depend on Him.

"...For the Lord will go before you, the God of Israel will be your rear guard" (Isa. 52:12b).

#### LIFE EXPERIENCES CAN REPRESENT LIGHT OR DARKNESS.

- Disappointments and afflictions can bring growth as teachable moments.
- Death for an unbeliever is destruction while death for a Christian is delight.
- Fear not. Move forward. Have faith.

"For we know that if our temporary, earthly dwelling is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal dwelling in the heavens, not made with hands" (II Cor. 5:1).
